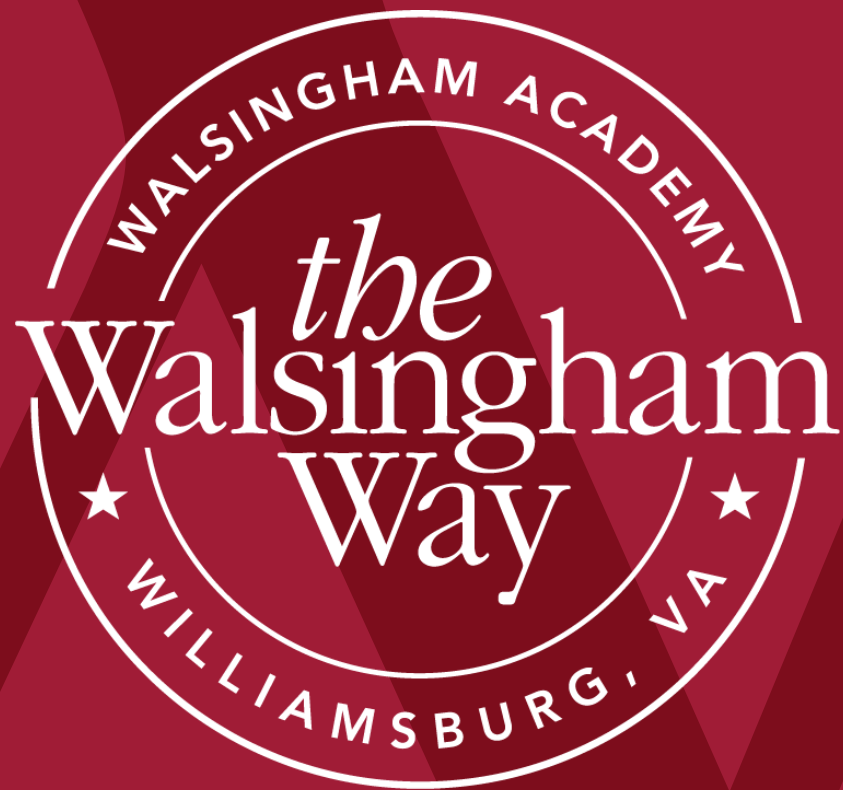

ACADEMIC PROFILE 2018 – 2019

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Founded in 1947, Walsingham Academy is a Catholic, co-educational, independent school, serving students from pre-kindergarten through 12th Grade and sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy. Situated on 30 acres of wooded land, the Academy is located in Williamsburg, Virginia, a city of more than 10,000. Admission to the Upper School is selective, based on standardized test scores, grades, teacher recommendations, and personal interviews.

Walsingham Academy is a distinguished Catholic, Christ-centered community for academic excellence.

The Academy is dedicated to the growth of each individual — spiritual understanding, intellectual achievement, physical well-being, and social responsibility. Walsingham emphasizes the Mercy commitment to serve persons in need. Students participate in service opportunities, which enable them to explore what it means to put the values of service and compassion into action. Such service experiences provide students with a richer context for their rigorous academic endeavors. Upper School students average over 6,000 community service hours as a student body each year.

Walsingham Academy is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS/AdvancED) and the National Catholic Education Association (NCEA). The Academy is also a member of the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS).

Most students exceed the minimum requirements. All students graduate from Walsingham with an Advanced Diploma. Standard Diplomas are awarded as determined by individual education accommodations. Beyond the Fine Arts requirement, students may participate for pass/fail credit in the Academy's music ensemble and/or its choir, The Madrigals.

WEIGHTING

Grades earned in Honors and AP courses are weighted by adding values of 0.5 and 1.0 respectively to the converted 4.0 GPA. For example, an 85 (B) earned in an AP class receives a $3.0 + 1.0 = 4.0$. Failing grades receive no weighting.

CLASS RANK & GPA

A college preparatory curriculum is offered at Walsingham and each graduating class is small, therefore Walsingham Academy does not rank its students. In addition to a weighted cumulative grade point average, the GPA is shown on the transcript for each school year the student is at Walsingham Academy.
